# Dates for your Diary

9th January - Children back to school 12th January — Book Launch Days Year 6: In Year 6, we have had a very busy end to our half term. In D&T, the children have designed and made a motorised WWII model vehicle, using their woodwork and computing skills. They have tinkered with the CrumbleKit and coding software to not only make the wheels turn, but many have also added complex programming for stopping sensors and steering. In Writing, the children have completed their discussion texts about whether evacuation was the right thing to do during WWII, showing both sides of the argument before coming to their own conclusions. They have also used everything they have been taught so far this term to invent their own WWII based stories on j2e.

Foundation Stage: We have had such a busy few weeks in Foundation getting ready for our fabulous Nativities. The children all did an amazing job and we were all incredibly proud of their performances. In Foundation Stage Two we have been getting into the Christmas spirit with a 'Present wrapping station' and even a post office for the children to write and post their letters to Santa. We have also continued to enjoy our class text 'A Polar Bear in the Snow' with the children both drawing and writing about the story and of course learning about life in the Arctic.

In Foundation Stage One, the children found a series of special letters from Santa, which had been left in the classroom by the elves. Earlier this week, a note arrived stating that Santa would contact the children via video call. Before the phone rang, the children busily generated questions in pairs to ask Santa about his preparations for his epic journey on Christmas Eve. The children loved talking to Santa and in turn, Santa was very impressed by the polite way they communicated. Mr Harris also dropped by to read a wonderful story to the children called 'What the Ladybird Heard', which was enjoyed by all.

Year 5: We have had a busy half term! In Writing, we have been writing a journey tale about Harrison Beck and his friend Lenny travelling on a train through different areas of the world. We also used the book 'The Safari Star' to help us write our journey tales. Continually, we have been writing persuasive texts to persuade people to ride on a train we have created. In Maths, we have finished our fractions unit and started the second half of our multiplication and division unit. We have learnt how to do short division and long multiplication to help us with our arithmetic. In D&T, we have been designing and making emergency vehicles that are fit for purpose. We looked at the design of emergency vehicles and used this to help us design our own. We also used our computing skills to help us code CrumbleKits to put inside of our vehicles to help them move. In RE, we visited St Mary's Church and learnt about how Jesus shows peace and the church shows peace. We are looking forward to a busy half term next half term and welcoming everyone back in January. ### Year 3:
