Year 6:

In Year 6 this Half Term we have become masters of fractions! The children have learnt to add, subtract and multiply fractions — a skill which has helped them improve their 40 test scores. In Computing, the children have been exploring the crumble kits, coding lights and motors to move, in preparation for designing and building their own WW2 vehicles in our DT lessons. In Science, we have been looking at light and shadows. In Writing, the children have been exploring characterisation and how to use this to improve their work, whilst writing a journey story based on The Midnight Guardians.

Foundation Stage:

We have had a very busy start to the Half Term here in Foundation Stage Two. We have enjoyed learning about bonfire night, Diwali, Remembrance Day and of course Children in Need as well. The children have loved getting very creative and have made all sorts of wonderful creations, from fire work pictures to Rangoli patterns and poppies to Pudsey bear. We have also launched into our brand new story about a polar bear in the Arctic, we have started to explore the wonderful world of ice and even carried out our own experiments to rescue an animal trapped in the ice. In Foundation Stage One we have been thinking all about our wonderful weather and how weather changes day to day and across the year. We have been looking at weather forecasts and the symbols that are used to represent different types of weather. We started to create our own weather stories. We have even set up our own travel agency where the children can book to travel to a hot or a cold place and think about what you might need to pack in your suitcase.

Year 5:

This Half Term has been a busy one in Year 5. In Maths we have carried on with our fractions unit, which the children have taken in their stride. In Writing, Hal and Lenny's adventure has come to an end as the children have written their independent application, so many exciting stories to read! In Geography we 'travelled' the capital cities of the globe and learnt to calculate time differences. The children have created their own booklets of cities and countries. In Computing we have been coding various sequences for Crumble kits, including switches, buzzers and motors. Our gymnastic PE unit has been extremely successful, where the children have demonstrated their skills in travelling, balances and rolls. In RE we are very much looking forward to our education visit to find out about how Jesus brought peace to his believers, then in Science, we started our chemistry unit, learning about solutions and evaporation.

Year 3:

This Half Term Year 3 having been enjoying reading and writing about robots in our English curriculum. We have read 'The Iron Man' by Ted Hughes and 'The Wild Robot' by Peter Brown. These stories have really fired the children's creativity. In Maths, we have been measuring area of different shapes. We are moving onto multiplication and division. Year 4 will be learning the 6, 7, 9, 11 and 12 timetables. Amazingly, we were the top year group in the school during the TT Rockstars England Rocks tournament! Keep up the hard work!

In gymnastics, we have enjoyed practising rolling, balancing and flight which we then put together in a sequence and transferred onto apparatus. We are all very excited for swimming next month!
