Foundation Stage:

What a busy few weeks we have had in our Foundation Stage! We have been fully immersed in the world of 'The Three Little Pigs' and have loved learning our story map in both FS1 and FS2. In FS1 the children have been super designers and for Book Launch Day each brought in their own representation of a building on Kingswood. We loved welcoming a variety of pigs, wolves and builders for our Book Launch Day in FS2; thank you to all of our wonderful parents and careers for your fantastic efforts!

In FS1, the children have got a brand new role play area based around construction. They have been working hard as builders to build the strongest house using lots of different materials. In FS2 we have been developing our colour mixing skills to colour mix and paint a picture of a pig.

Year 5:

In Year 5, we have had a busy start to the term! The children came back from Christmas refreshed and ready to learn and they have hit the ground running. In our Writing lessons, we have been exploring the book 'RumbleStar', which follows main character Casper Tock on an adventure through a magical land. From this, we have been writing portal stories, exploring how characters can move from one world to another through a portal. In Maths, we have finished our fractions topic and have now moved onto our decimals and percentages topic. In this, we have explored what tenths and hundredths are and we have looked at finding equivalent fractions and decimals. In History, we have investigated the Anglo-Saxon rule on England and how they came to power then eventually lost power. In Science, we have explored Space and started to understand why we have day and night and why the moon looks different in the sky each night. This is leading to our Planetarium visit, which we are very excited for. In PSHE, we have talked about our dreams and goals for the future and have begun to think about how we might achieve these and the steps needed to achieve these goals. We look forward to the rest of the half term and all the exciting things planned!

Year 3:

We have had a great start to the term with a fantastic Book Launch Day, dressed as the main character from our book. Everyone in the year group looked amazing. We enjoyed creating a map of the island using a tea-stained effect. In Writing we have been writing a finding tale, we have focused on action using powerful verbs. In our Math lesson, we have been continuing multiplication and division, but now moving onto multiplying two-digit numbers by one-digit numbers. In History, we have looked at two important people who had an impact on Hull, Lillian Bilocca and Phillip Larkin, and decided who we felt had the greatest impact. We have started our dance unit in PE and have been blown away by the efforts of the children and how well they have taken to salsa.

Year 4:

We had an amazing start to the term dressed as dragons! We enjoyed creating mountain dioramas and reading more of our new class text 'Dragon Mountain'. In Writing, we have been writing a journey tale based on this book. We have focused on writing action filled stories! In History, we have been learning about William Wilberforce and how his actions impacted civil rights. The children have been involved in discussions about Wilberforce's life and the actions he took during the 1800s. Also, we have recently moved onto Art. This Term, we are looking closely at work by John Horace Hooper and his fantastic landscape paintings. We look forward to show you what we have learned at our art parent workshop soon!

Year 1:

We have had a fantastic start to this half term. Everyone looked amazing dressed up on our Book Launch Day. In our History lessons, we have enjoyed learning about Neil Armstrong and how space travel has changed over time. We had fun pretending to be Neil Armstrong and answering questions about his mission to the moon.

In Writing, we have been learning all about 'RocketMole' and his trip to the moon. We have started writing our own stories about a different animal going to the moon.

In Maths, we have moved on to looking at numbers to 20. We have been finding 1 more and 1 less than a given number within 20. We have also been learning about how many tens and ones there are in different numbers.

We have started our dance unit in PE. We are really enjoying thinking of different ways that we can move for a count of 8. We have also been thinking about how we can move to different pieces of music.



Year 2:

We have had a great start to spring term. We dressed up for summer on our Book Launch Day and followed Flat Stanley on his journey to California. We are really loving learning about Stanley's life and the challenges he has faced. During our Writing unit, we have started to write a warning story. In History, we have learnt about the impact Rosa Parks and Emily Davison have had. We visited the Feren's Art Gallery last week to look at a number of landscape paintings by famous artists. We are looking forward to using some of the ideas we saw in our own landscape paintings. We have worked hard in Maths to learn the different coins and notes we use in the UK.
