### Time allocated per week for Curriculum Music

The National Plan for Music Education (NPME) recommends that schools timetable at least one hour each week of the school year for music throughout Key Stages 1 and 2.

We currently timetable:

- Key Stage 1 1 hour
- Key Stage 2 1 hour

#### <u>Music curriculum</u>

• Our music curriculum is covering all national curriculum objectives informed by the <u>model music curriculum</u> (March 2021), non-statutory guidance for teaching music from Key Stages 1 to 2 or any other published curriculum guidance. The Sing-Up Scheme has been adapted to meet the needs of our children.

#### **Opportunities for pupils during lesson time**

- As a school, we provide the following opportunities for pupils to learn to sing or play an instrument during lesson time:
  - Children learn the glockenspiel Year 1-6
  - Children learn the ukulele in Year 3
  - Children learn the violin on Year 4 as part of wider options
  - Children sing in every music lesson

### <u>Partnerships</u>
