Year 6: In Year 6 the children have blown us away with their writing based on the short film 'Alma'. They have fully embraced the suspenseful writing and have created some wonderfully spooky stories. They are now looking at how to persuade someone to visit their chosen country, making sure they engage with the reader. In our Maths lessons, we have been delving into the word of angles. The children can now confidently explain how to find missing angles in a triangle and a quadrilateral. In Science we have been investigating current and voltage through our electricity topic. We hope you all have a well deserved rest and come back ready to learn after Easter.

Foundation Stage:

In the Foundation Stage One the children have been very busy learning all about 'Jaspers Beanstalk'. We have been performing the story map to each other. We have planted cress and continued to grow this at home making it look like our silly hair. The children have been busy learning all about number 4 where they have been counting out the correct amount of objects to match the numeral. In Phonics we have continued to learn unit 1 sounds and begin to say the sounds and read the words. The children have been amazing!

In the Foundation Stage Two the children have learnt all about 'Jack and the beanstalk'. They have made a garden for Jack using junk modelling materials and have planted a range of seeds. In Maths we have been doubling and halving learning the song to help us remember our doubles and halves. Well done everyone on a fantastic half term!

Year 5:

Year 5 has been extremely busy this March. We have been learning about how to read and plot co-orinates, and learned how to use a protractor. We have measured and drawn angles. In Writing, we have been learning about instruction texts and wrote our own How to travel around Rumblestar text. In Science, we have learned about forces and experimented with friction by sending cars down on different surfaces to see how the surface affected the distance the car would travel. In Geography, we learned about the water cycle and why people have settled along the Nile, the Amazon River and the River Hull. We can now also identify the physical features of a river. We also had a visit from the Hull Music Service Rock Band, who have guided us through the decades of rock music.

We have finished reading our 'Maybe Football is Exciting' text by Tom Palmer and 'The Wreck of the Zanzibar' by Michael Morpurgo. We are looking forward to a much deserved Easter break.

Year 3:

What a fantastic time Year 3 had in Bridlington. The weather was very kind to us! The children represent their school very well and impressed with their good behaviour and manners. The children were able to demonstrate their strong knowledge of Bridlington's physical and human features.

In Writing, we have completed lots of learning inspired by this trip. We have use descriptive writing and a range of conjunctions to describe a wide variety of sweet and savoury foods. The children were so creative! In addition, all the teachers are noticing a big improvement in both handwriting and spelling. Keep up the good work Year 3.

Year 4: What a busy half term we have had in Year4 In Geography, the children have been learning all about the different mountain ranges around the world, and have identified their physical and human features. In Writing, they have written a newspaper report, as well as suspenseful pieces of writing. As scientists, the children have constructed simple series circuits, making predictions as to which circuits will allow electricity to flow.

Our violin concert was a huge success, with the children performing their learned pieces and showing off all their hard work! In DT, we are planning our creative cupcakes based on 'The Giant's Necklace' and are excited to make them after the holidays. We hope you have a lovely Easter Break and enjoy the sunshine. Year 1:

In our Writing lessons, we have been reading 'Sylvia and Bird'. In the story, Sylvia helps Bird to make her nest. We went on a walk to the woods to collect materials to build our own nest. After, we wrote instructions about how we made the nest.

In Science, we tested different materials to see if they were waterproof. We then used this knowledge to design and make our own waterproof house. We used water to test if our houses were waterproof.

We have had lots of fun in our Design and Technology lessons, we designed and created our own sandwich. We learnt how to cut and grate safely before making our sandwich.

In our Maths lessons we have been learning about Mass and Capacity. We used scales to weigh different items around the classroom. When learning about capacity, we used different containers and a jug of water to show when they were empty, half full and full.

The children have enjoyed learning to follow a recipe, weigh ingredients and make a dough. The children did a fantastic job at replicating their designs and decorating their biscuits.

In Computing, we have been using weather data for Hull and Cairo to create bar charts, linking to our new Geography knowledge. The children have enjoyed learning about Cairo and how it is different from Hull, identifying the human and physical features of both.

We have read a variety of interesting new texts this term. The children have enjoyed reading 'The Giraffe, The Pelly and Me', exploring the story and then creating their own pieces inspired by the text.
